Public Hearing: Bond Order – Hood Elementary School

That the City appropriates the amount of amount of five million eight hundred eighty-two thousand one hundred and ninety-three (\$5,882,193.00) dollars for the purpose of paying costs for the design and replacement of the roof and windows/doors at the Hood Elementary School, located at 24 Oakwood Avenue, Lynn Massachusetts, including the payment of all costs incidental or related thereto (the "Project"), which proposed repair project would materially extend the useful life of the school and preserve an asset that otherwise is capable of supporting the required educational programs, and for which the City of Lynn may be eligible for a grant from the Massachusetts School Building Authority (MSBA), said amount to be expended under the direction of the School Building Committee. To meet this appropriation the City Treasurer, with the approval of the Mayor, is hereby authorized to borrow said amount under and pursuant to G. L. c. 44, as amended and supplemented, or any other enabling authority, and to issue bonds or notes of the City therefor. The City acknowledges that the MSBA's grant program is a non-entitlement, discretionary program based on need, as determined by the MSBA, and any Project costs the City incurs in excess of any grant approved by and received from the MSBA on account of the Project shall not exceed the lesser of (i) seventy-nine and 58/100 percent (79.58%) of eligible approved Project costs, as determined by the MSBA, or (ii) the total maximum grant amount determined by the MSBA; and that the amount of borrowing authorized pursuant to this vote shall be reduced by any grant amount set forth in the Project Funding Agreement relating to the Project that may be executed between the City and the MSBA. Any premium received upon the sale of any bonds or notes approved by this order, less any such premium applied to the payment of the costs of issuance of such bonds or notes, may be applied to the payment of costs approved by this order in accordance with G. L. c. 44, §20, thereby reducing the amount authorized to be borrowed to pay such costs by a like amount.

FURTHER ORDERED: That the Treasurer is authorized to file an application with the appropriate officials of The Commonwealth of Massachusetts (the "Commonwealth") to qualify under Chapter 44A of the General Laws any and all bonds of the City authorized by this Order, and to provide such information and execute such

documents as such officials of the Commonwealth may require in connection therewith.
